This is due to the fact that you can charge your client thousands of dollars just for one evening. However, this usually isn't just for the photographs. Most people have their pictures framed, sent out in little booklets or even made into mini movies! There is a lot of money to be made by photographing events but it comes with a lot of work.

There are many types of events you can photograph such as weddings, proms, birthdays, engagement parties, baby showers and many more. The average price for a photographer to cover your entire wedding can be \$2,000 – \$5,000! These include, as previously stated, coverage of your whole wedding and typically multiple photographers. Obviously, the higher someone is willing to pay, the more value you'll provide with your service.

For example, multiple photographers covering a wedding that lasts 8 hours and simultaneously videotaping can turn you a huge profit. With a bundle like that, you can expect that people are willing to pay well over \$2,000. However, the quality must be on par. No one is going to be pleased with work that looks like it was done by amateurs, especially at that price point. Therefore, price according to what you believe your skill is worth at the moment and work your way up!

Photographing Social Media
